

THE COMMISSIONERS OF FIRE DISTRICT NO. 2
BOROUGH OF TINTON FALLS, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH
September 5, 2021, Minutes - Regular Meeting

Albert Neis called the regular meeting of the Commissioners to order at 19:30, at which time the pledge to the flag was given.

In accordance with the Open Meetings Act, Albert Neis read the following statement; “Adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the Open Meetings Act by the adoption of a schedule of meetings and notice thereof being posted in the municipal building, being filed with the municipal clerk and being transmitted to the Hub and the Coaster all within 48 hours prior to this meeting. And posted on the website and held in accordance with an executive order in relation to virtual meetings due to the pandemic.”

When roll call was taken, it showed commissioners Albert Neis, Charles Bell, Peter Maclearie, Brendan Tobin, and Mason Lewis at the meeting.

CORRESPONDENCE

Mason Lewis received and responded to a letter from Selective about an unclaimed check.

Peter Maclearie said a check for the life insurance was issued between the meetings which was approved at the prior meeting. Peter Maclearie and Brendan Tobin has been meeting with District 1.

OLD BUSINESS

Brendan Tobin said that he has not heard back from District 1 on the grant and we can assume they will not be moving forward. He also said he is waiting on final word on the radio grant.

NEW BUSINESS

Brendan Tobin made a motion not to exceed fifty thousand dollars for the deposit to Seagrave for the 477 refurbishment with a second by Charles Bell. When roll call was taken all commissioners approved the motion.

CHIEF REPORTS

Chief Daniel Evankow reported on August calls and training for Station 1. He requested to purchase: Request for Purchase: One (1) Knox Box- KeySecure 5- \$973.49, Ten (10) DragonFire BBP Rescue Gloves- \$580.00, One (1) Fire-Dex FDXL200 Structural Boot- \$359.59, Key Hose- Two (2) Key Hose 3” Big-10- (ea.- \$262.5), One (1) Key Hose 2.5” Combat Ready- (ea.- \$332.5), Two (2) Key Hose 1.75” Combat Ready- (ea.- \$265.00)- TOTAL- \$1537.5. Charles Bell made a motion to approve his purchase requests with a second by Brendan Tobin. All in favor. He also mentioned that they were requested to help with Oceanport for their 9/11 fireworks.

Chief Ronald Neis reported on July calls and training for Northside. He requested to purchase three-inch hose (\$3,000), five-inch hose (\$3,060), repairs for two gas meters, radio (\$6,400), and a fold a tank replacement line (\$600).

Charles Bell made a motion to accept the chiefs’ report with a second by Brendan Tobin. All in favor.

PERSONNEL

PUBLIC

Brendan Tobin made a motion to open the public section with a second by Charles Bell. All in favor.

Cindy Anderson provided an update on the workers compensation claim that closed significantly lower than the reserved estimated by the carrier. The carrier won against the hospital. She also said the Geico claim over the 167 Parkway accident is still ongoing.

Charles Bell made a motion to close the public section with a second by Brendan Tobin. All in favor.

TREASURER

Mason Lewis reviewed the bill list for September.

BILLS

Brendan Tobin motioned to approve the bill list for September with a bill for VFIS life insurance policy added (\$4,998.89 – instead of in August) and the deposit check for Seagrave added a second by Charles Bell. All in favor.

There being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made at 19:41 by Brendan Tobin with a second by Charles Bell. All commissioners were in favor of this motion.
